The four primary components of a completed college application file include the student's application, high school transcript, test scores (if applicable), and recommendations.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Student determines need for recommendations (either teacher and/or counselor); some colleges do not require or read them.

Students must request a recommendation from their School Counselor/Teacher at least 15 school days prior to application deadline. Students also MUST complete the Counselor Questionnaire on Naviance in order to receive a letter from their Counselor. See transcript deadline page.

TRANSCRIPT

Student requests high school transcript (which will be sent to the college directly by FHS).

An FCPS Consent <u>for Release of Student</u>

<u>Records Form</u> must be on file in order for FHS to send official transcripts.

<u>FHS Transcript Request Form</u> can be found on the FHS website in the transcript section.

Students must request their transcripts by the FHS Deadlines (see chart of deadlines).

It is the student's responsibility to monitor the status of their college applications, to make sure the college has received all materials. Check emails or the college's application portal/website.

TEST SCORES

Student requests test scores directly from the testing agency (<u>College Board</u> or <u>ACT</u>).

The timeframe for score delivery depends on the way a college chooses to receive scores.

Once colleges receive your scores, processing could take up to a week or more.

College Application Responsibilities

TRANSCRIPT ASSISTANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- Receive FCPS Consent for Release of Student Records (IS-111) and Transcript Request Form from the student.
 - Check for parent signature (for students under 18 years of age)
 - Process information
 - Prepare the transcript packet: Fairfax School Profile and Academic Transcript
 - Give transcript form and packet to the appropriate counselor

COUNSELOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- Complete Secondary School Report Form
- Complete letter of recommendation utilizing student's responses from Naviance questionnaire. As a reminder, students have at least 15 school days prior to the application deadline to request a letter of recommendation.
- Submit Official Transcript, Secondary School Report Form, FHS School Profile and Letter of Recommendation (if applicable) directly to the college/university.

Students are responsible for having official test scores sent directly from College Board (www.collegeboard.org) or ACT (www.act.org) to their colleges and the NCAA Clearinghouse (if applicable).

FHS does NOT send test scores.

STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- Complete your application online and submit it directly to the college/university with your payment.
- Request test scores directly from testing agency (College Board or ACT). FHS does NOT send test scores.
- Complete the <u>FCPS Consent for Release of Student Records (IS-111)</u>
 <u>Form.</u> This form must be on file in order for FHS to release official transcripts to colleges and scholarship organizations. This form must have a parent/guardian signature (if student under 18 years of age). Regardless of your plans, ALL seniors are encouraged to submit this form in the fall of their senior year.
- Complete a <u>Fairfax Transcript Request Form</u>. This form must be fully completed before any transcripts will be released to colleges or universities. (*Refer to "Letters of Rec"* section for more details).
- If you are applying to colleges via Common App, you must list all colleges on your Transcript Request Form.
- Discuss with your counselor the need for a counselor recommendation. Refer to Instructions for Requesting a Letter of Recommendation in the Guide.
 - Some colleges do not ask for, nor read, recommendations.
 - Students should give their recommenders <u>at least</u> fifteen school days notice before the college deadline in order to receive a letter.
- Check status of transcript requests (<u>Naviance</u> > Colleges > Apply to College > Manage Transcripts)
- Monitor applicant portals to confirm receipt of all application materials by your colleges. Check your email on a regular basis!

Transcript Request Procedures

- An FCPS Consent for Release of Student Records (Transcript Release) Form
 must be on file in order for FHS to release official transcripts to colleges
 and scholarship organizations. This form must have a parent/guardian
 signature. Regardless of their plans, all seniors are encouraged to submit this
 form in the fall of their senior year.
- A <u>Fairfax High Transcript Request Form</u> must be completed before any transcripts will be released to colleges or universities.
- All transcript requests must either be EMAILED or given directly, in person, to the transcript assistant (NOT the counselor). Mrs. Scibilia's hours are Monday Friday, 8:30am 12:30pm; she is not here before or after school, so plan accordingly. Mrs. Scibilia will process the request and then pass the request to the student's school counselor, who is responsible for sending the transcript to the college.
- PLAN ACCORDINGLY! A minimum of 15 school days is required before the college application deadline.
 - Transcript requests received less than 72 hours from the college deadline are NOT guaranteed to be sent by the deadline.
- Complete your college application online and submit it directly to the college/university with your college application fee. NOTE: FHS will send the transcript packet directly to the college/university. FHS does not handle or submit the college application.
- Students are responsible for having official test scores sent directly from the College Board and/or ACT. FHS does not send test scores.

PLAN AHEAD!

Make sure you have communicated with your school counselor and competed any necessary information (i.e. Counselor Letter of Recommendation Questionnaire) if you are requesting a letter of recommendation.

Instructions for Requesting a Letter of Recommendation

Recommendations take TIME and REQUIRE SPECIFIC INFORMATION.

- Determine whether or not you will need teacher and/or counselor recommendations (some colleges do not ask for, nor read, recommendations).
- Plan ahead and give your recommenders plenty of time and information so they are able to write the best recommendation possible.
- It is expected that you will provide notice to your recommenders at least 15 school days prior to application due date.

Recommendations fall into two categories:

Teacher Recommendation and Counselor Recommendation

• Teacher Recommendation

- This recommendation should include information regarding the student's academic strengths, habits, and skills that the academic teacher has directly observed.
- The student should ask teachers with whom the student had or has good working relationships if they are willing AND able to write a strong letter of recommendation on the student's behalf.
- The student should provide teachers with information to assist in writing the letter, see <u>Teacher Recommendation Form</u>.
- The student should also confirm with the teacher how the recommendation should be submitted.
- The student should provide teachers with a list of colleges for which recommendations are needed and deadlines for those colleges.


• Counselor Recommendation

- This recommendation includes specific comments regarding the student as a person: Individual traits, demonstrated character strengths, activities, etc.
- The student should confirm with his/her counselor the need for a recommendation. The colleges that do not require recommendations do not read them unless there has been extenuating circumstances that address concerns on a student's transcript.
- The student requests recommendation letters for specific colleges by completing the FHS Counselor Letter of Recommendation Questionnaire found on Naviance..
- The student should provide the counselor with information to assist in writing the letter. The priority deadline for completing the Questionnaire is September 30!
 - The student is <u>required</u> to complete the questionnaire at least 15 school days before their first application deadline.
 - The more information and details you provide, the stronger the letter of recommendation the counselor will be able to write.
 - Once completed, the student <u>must</u> email their counselor to let them know they completed the survey and would like to request a letter of recommendation. Feel free to also send your resume if you have completed one with your request.



How to Sign Up for a College Visit in Naviance 2023-24

- 1. Log into Naviance
- 2. Click on Colleges > College Visits
- 3. Click on "Register Now"
- 4. Ask your teacher for permission (verbally or through email) to be excused from class AT LEAST 24 HOURS BEFORE THE VISIT!
- 5. Before heading to the College & Career Center (Room L106) for the scheduled visit, show the Naviance confirmation/registration screen on your laptop or phone to your teacher as a reminder (preferably at the beginning of class).
- 6. Attendance will be taken at all visits. Students are responsible for missed assignments.


Naviance & x2VOL

Naviance & x2VOL

x2VOL is the tool that FCPS middle and high schools use to support students with finding, tracking, and verifying service hours electronically. Students login to x2VOL through this Naviance link on the FCPS website.

- ✓ Students should track their hours in <u>x2VOL</u>
- ✓ Students are <u>able to earn a diploma</u> in the Commonwealth of Virginia <u>without completing service hours</u>
- ✓ 40 hours = black service learning cord to wear at graduation
- ✓ 50 hours with additional criteria = apply for <u>The Board of Education's Seal</u> of Excellence in Civics Education
- ✓ 50 exclusive hours related to science service with additional criteria = apply for The Science & Environmental Seal
- Students who do not complete yearly service hours or who complete fewer than 40 hours over the course of high school will still be able to graduate





DEFINITIONS OF ADMISSION OPTIONS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

STUDENTS: WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment.

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll and withdraw all other applications. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NON-BINDING

Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.

There are BIG changes to the 2024-25 **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**, which is being called the "Better FAFSA."

Federal Student Aid has announced that the new FAFSA will open in December 2023, but no specific date has been announced.



FHS-Exclusive Scholarships for Seniors

These scholarships, <u>once they become available</u>, will be advertised to students with eligibility requirements, additional details and application due dates. These scholarships are based on the previous school year, please note that any changes will be reflected when the scholarship application is available for the current school year.

City of Fairfax School Board Janice Miller Scholarship \$2,000: Graduating senior with GPA of 3.0 or better, attending a 2- or 4-year college or university, community service and leadership as demonstrated by curricular or extracurricular activities, and community-based service, and an essay of 500 words or less describing your personal goals and reasons for pursuing your chosen field of study and/or career and a statement of financial need.

Fairfax Rotary Club Pat Laing Memorial Scholarship \$8,000: Open to FHS seniors planning to attend a Virginia in-state, public, 4-year university in the fall. Must be US Citizen or permanent legal resident to apply. Selection based on financial need, character, and scholastic performance. Additional requirement will be to include an essay of 2-3 pages on "How I see myself five to ten years from the present."

Fairfax Rotary Memorial Scholarship \$5,000: Open to FHS seniors planning to attend a Virginia in-state, public 4-year university in the fall. Must be US Citizen or permanent legal resident to apply. Selection based on financial need, character, and scholastic performance. Additional requirement will be to include an essay of 1-2 pages on "Why I am proud to be an American."

Fairfax Rotary Club's Setty Family Scholarship \$5,000: Open to FHS seniors planning to attend a Virginia in-state, public 4-year college university in the fall. Must be US Citizen or legal permanent resident to apply. Selection based on financial need, character, and scholastic performance. Additional requirement will be to include an essay of 1-2 pages on the following: "The Rotary Club's Motto is: Service Above Self. Describe a group, organization or community that you are involved in and how you have served this group."

FHS-Exclusive Scholarships for Seniors (continued)

Fairfax Rotary Paul J Brown Community Service Award \$500: This award will go to an FHS senior with at least a 3.0 GPA who is a US Citizen or permanent legal resident. The student must have strong moral character and have participated actively in serving the community through service hours or by establishing or participating in service projects.

M2 Solutions Inc. \$1500: For seniors with 3.0 GPA or higher who are pursuing community college, technical school or a 4 year college or university and plan to pursue a career in the STEM field.

Justen and Carolyn Pitches Scholarship \$2,000: Open to FAIRFAX CITY RESIDENTS graduating from Fairfax High School and planning to attend NOVA in the Fall. Selection will be based on financial need, community service and/or extracurricular activities, Please answer the following essay question: Describe a person or event that impacted your life.

Loretta Khayam Scholarship \$1,500: For a graduating senior from Fairfax High School who has attained a Grade Point Average of 2.5 or below, and, by graduation, has completed math courses no higher than Algebra II. Candidates should plan on pursuing further education at a two- or four-year accredited institution or technical school. This scholarship is managed by College Access Fairfax each year: https://collegeaccessfairfax.org/scholarships/ and usually due in February.

FHS can nominate one senior who best exemplifies excellence in the Jeffersonian ideals of leadership, scholarship, and citizenship, and are the first in their families to earn a bachelor's degree from a four-year college or university.

Scholarships that Require FHS Nomination (continued)

VHSL Allstate Achievement Scholarship, \$1,500: https://www.vhsl.org/scholarships/ is awarded to seniors who have excelled in the classroom and in athletic and academic activities. FHS can nominate one male and one female athlete.

VHSL Savedge Award, \$500: https://www.vhsl.org/scholarships/ is awarded to a senior who has participated and excelled in school publications (magazines, newspapers, yearbooks) and for at least two years demonstrated outstanding personal qualities such as leadership, writing proficiency, design aptitude, creativity, teamwork, and character.

W. Harold Ford Scholarship Foundation, Teaching Scholarship, \$2,000: This is a local scholarship for students with at least at 2.7 GPA who plan to attend a four-year college which offers a teacher education/certification program, major in education and plan to teach after college graduation. FHS can nominate two seniors for this award. Visit https://www.fcre.org/scholarship/ for details.

Virginia Tech Pamplin Leadership Award: A one-year, merit-based \$5,000 Virginia Tech tuition scholarship. The scholarship is open to students applying to all majors. Pamplin Leaders are students who demonstrate superior intellectual promise and academic performance, dedication to their communities, interest and success in physical fitness and health, and unimpeachable integrity. Students who accept this award must also agree to join the University Honors and work toward an honors diploma. FHS can nominate one senior for this award.

FCPS Facilitated Scholarships

These scholarships are typically submitted to the FHS College & Career Center. From the applicant pool, FHS will forward selected nominees to FCPS for consideration.

Laura Ashley Piper Scholarship, \$1,000: Demonstrated integrity, leadership, service to school and community, academic excellence, athletic merit. FHS will submit one application to FCPS.

Vulcan Materials Scholarship, \$2,000/renewable: FHS can nominate ONE senior for this award. Must be US citizen and must have resided in Northern Virginia for at least 4 years immediately preceding his/her nomination. Preference is given to students planning to attend a college in Virginia. Criteria: financial need, academic accomplishment and ability, extracurricular activities and an essay

William J. Foreman Memorial Scholarship, up to \$2,000: Open to graduating high school seniors from Fairfax County who demonstrate academic achievement and potential; an ability to overcome significant adversity; and a financial need. Priority will be given to those who have experienced homelessness, foster care, or a lack of substantial family support during their high school career.

Michell Merhige Scholarship \$1,500: This scholarship is to provide recognition and financial assistance to a graduating senior of FCPS with academic strength and potential, ability to overcome adversity and demonstrated financial need. Priority will be given to those who have experienced homelessness, been in foster care, or lacked substantial family support.

Academic Common Market

Students seeking a major/program not offered by a college in Virginia may qualify for in-state tuition rates at an out-of-state school. This website lists the agreements established between states and schools for particular programs. Students must be accepted to the school in that specific program in order to qualify for in-state rates. Agreements are updated annually but there are currently 161 separate agreements for VA residents for bachelor's degree programs.

Non-Resident Scholarships for Virginia Students
